worked in the Faculty of Education Hong Kong University and Hong Kong Government Curriculum Development Institute Education Department. He has been a visiting scholar and adjunct professor at Universities of Tokyo Gagukei, East China Normal, and Twente Holland. Dr. Law specializes in curriculum and leadership studies, language in education and socio-cultural and discourse approaches to the study of curriculum. His authored book publications include: Using English as the Medium of Instruction (Longman 1993), Foundations of Curriculum Development Theories (Shandong China & Taiwan 2002), Curriculum Paradigm Shift - curriculum reforms in Shanghai and Hong Kong (Shanghai Science and Technology Education 2003).
