Dr. Do Huy Thinh is a member of international professional organizations such as TESOL Inc., American Educational Research Association, Comparative and International Education Society, NAFSA, TEFL Asia and so on. Dr. Do Huy Thinh has been the Director of SEAMEO Regional Training Center in Vietnam since 2003. Furthermore, he is also the founding President of the TESOL-HCMC Association.
