Trends in Developing Educational Leadership in Vietnam

Effective education leadership is known as one of the key factors for a high quality education system. With Vietnam's Open Door policy, the country's accession to globalization and the ineffective status quo of the system, the demand for reform to improve the education quality has become ever more imperative.
