### (I) Creative Thinking and Music Performance

- ▶ Workshop participants will be engaged in the experimentation and execution of vocal production and sound manipulation. ### (III) Experiential Learning Exercise: Policy-making Simulation

- ▶ Scholars/practitioners will be invited to give mini lectures on specific public policies. Relevant films and video will be shown to enhance effective learning. Activities shall take the form of simulated role-plays in legislative debate. Students will be assigned debate motions in advance. They shall take turn in playing the roles of government officials, elected politicians, interest groups, or affected citizens or organisations. During the simulation exercise, students will experience the constraints within which the government has to operate in the process of policy formulation. They will become more aware of the various factors that the government has to take into account in making decisions.

### (IV) Mathematics Exploration

- ▶ Introducing dynamics geometry and 3D geometry software such as Cabri 3D;
- ▶ Using software as a tool to solve some interesting mathematics problem;
- ▶ Illustrating the lighter side of mathematics, which is not widely known to students, through fun and challenging activities such as games and puzzles;
- ▶ Broadening students’ mathematics horizon through their active participation in the activities;
- ▶ Number guessing games and introduction to Dissection problems and Tiling problems;
- ▶ The workshop is carefully designed so that it will not put students without M1 or M2 at a disadvantage.
