Attendance



- Be punctual for ALL course lectures.

Leave of Absence



- ➤ Under exceptional circumstances where students need to <u>take</u> a leave of absence for 30% of scheduled, face-to-face lectures or more, students should inform their course lecturers and are required to obtain prior approval from the Programme Leader by submitting a leave application form.
- Where special circumstances require students to <u>take a leave</u> <u>of absence exceeding 7 days but less than one semester</u>, students must seek approval from the Programme Leader by submitting a leave application form.
- ➤ Students who are absent for 30% of scheduled lecturers or more in a course without prior permission will be given a <u>"FAIL"</u> grade by their course lecturers.
