A career in counseling - working with gifted individuals in Asia

Giftedness is not a disorder. However, there are people who have learning and/or developmental problems that seem to be related to their high (intellectual or other) abilities. Just like learning and/ or development problems, (very) high abilities ask for a specific approach. Regular education and care seem to be insufficient to meet these needs. This can lead to problems ranging from boredom in the classroom to inappropriate behavior or depression. To prevent these kinds of problems, we need professionals who have the knowledge and experience to recognize these needs and who know how to meet them.

During this seminar, experts who work in research and practice will give an overview of the most important models, theories of and visions on gifted education. They will share their experiences with gifted students, their teachers and their parents. Through the seminar Psychology bachelor and Master graduates and final-year students could have a glimpse of working with the gifted and explore the opportunities of further education in the area. Participants will also get information about the Radboud International Training on High Ability (RITHA), a post-academic training for people who intend to develop a career as a specialist in identifying and working with the gifted. Two postgraduate programmes will be introduced to facilitate students' needs. For those looking for further training in their career and switching to work with the gifted: Part-time RITHA specialist programme to be launched in January 2021 in Hong Kong. For fresh graduate and final year students a full-time Master's specialization programme in Gifted Education (<https://www.ru.nl/english/education/masters/gifted-education/>) will also be introduced by the international policy officer (Mrs. Barbara van Ginneken) from Radboud University.
